Community Soup Kitchen "Souper Bowl" Sunday Event

Thanks to many dedicated volunteers, St. Joseph's has been a part of changing lives right in Morris County. Since 1984, the **Community Soup Kitchen & Outreach Center**, in downtown Morristown, has never missed a day serving a hot noon-time meal to nearly **300** homeless, working poor, elderly, and disabled guests in our area. In addition to the meal, the **Outreach Center provides services** so that guests can access the medical and social services needed to get back on their feet. During the last year, the Soup Kitchen served over 56,000 meals, distributed over 40 tons of food, and provided over 2,000 referrals through the Outreach Center. In addition to the challenges of increasing numbers of guests, the Soup Kitchen can no longer accept donations of food cooked by the community due to Board of Health regulations. As a result, expenses will increase by \$150,000 annually to cover the cost of the food, once lovingly made at home by volunteers. To help offset this cost, St. Joseph's is running a "**Souper Bowl Sunday**" fundraiser after each of the Masses **this weekend**. Volunteers will be at the doors with a "**Soup Pot**" decorated for each of the Super Bowl teams.
